
















University Core Instructor Evaluation Questions - Aggregate Chart


University Core Instructor Evaluation Questions - Aggregate Chart






University Core Instructor Evaluation Questions - Aggregate Chart

I honestly can't think of much of anything. The only small thing to make a note of is class discussions can become derailed fairly quickly, however, this is not always a bad thing.

I felt the readings were structured very well but I personally found the varied critiques of modernity section the most overwhelming since we were reading four separate thinkers in a relatively short amount of time. I would have preferred to instead just focus on one or two and feel I could have developed a deeper understanding that way.

I think clearer slides with less words on them would help break down the content even further. Additionally, speaking with a bit better inflection to reflect interest and important points.

The only small thing that could be super helpful for notetaking next semester would be posting the ppt slides to canvas before the lecture. Even if incomplete or incorrect, it would be super helpful to students, and they could take note of whatever changes you have made to the slide after posting.

The course was nearly perfect, however the powerpoint with quotes can be a little wordy and difficult. Although he discussed them and broke them down in class, I think it would be more helpful to break up large pieces of difficult text to make it easier to read.
